## Minneapolis DFL Caucus:

**The first step toward power-building in the electoral system is participation in the Precinct Caucus.**

**Minneapolis residents come together on the evening of Tuesday, April 8, 2025 at their designated caucus locations (on pages 4-6) and meet their neighbors and declare their support for candidates.**

**Based on the Minnesota DFL Party rules, the number of delegates to the next convention are determined based on previous turnout and chosen individually to attend the conventions.**

## Minneapolis DFL Caucus Process:

The Minneapolis DFL holds its caucuses on Tuesday, April 8. This is an important first step for municipal candidates seeking a DFL endorsement.

Registration for caucuses begins at 6:30 PM; with the meeting starting at 7 PM. You can find more information about the caucus process at: <https://minneapolisdf.org/2025/caucus-guide>.

## Caucus Participation Rules

- You live in the precinct.
- You consider yourself a member of the DFL Party and agree with DFL party values.
- You are not a member of any other political party.
- You will be 18 years or older by Election Day 2025.
- If you are 16 to 18 years old by Election Day 2025, you can still participate in other caucus work but cannot be elected to a role as a delegate or alternate or precinct officer.

## What Happens at the Caucus?

**1. The caucus leader reads rules for participating in caucuses.**

**2. The caucus leader reads a statement about DFL goals for diversity and inclusion.**

**3. The meeting selects who should lead the meeting and help with meeting tasks.**

**4. Check if anyone is concerned that another person is breaking the Caucus Participation Rules.**

**5. Pick delegates and alternates to the Ward Convention (where you endorse city council members).**

**6. Pick people to help plan the Ward Convention.**

**7. Pick delegates and alternates to the City Convention (where you endorse mayor, park board, and board of estimate & taxation)**

**8. Meeting finishes.**

***If you were picked as a delegate or alternate, make sure the caucus leader wrote down your information for the convention, and you got a reminder of the convention date and location.***

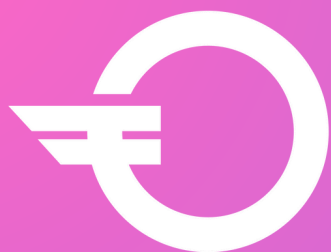
